¹ **36-4C-3. Respiratory care authorized.** Respiratory care may be performed in any clinic, hospital, skilled nursing facility, private dwelling, or other place deemed appropriate by the board, in accordance with the prescription or verbal order of a physician and **shall be performed under a qualified medical director** where mandated by institutional accrediting agencies.

² **36-4C-1. Definition of terms. Terms used in this chapter mean:** (4) "Qualified medical director," the physician responsible for the medical direction of any inpatient or outpatient respiratory care service, department, or home care agency. **The medical director shall be a licensed physician pursuant to chapter 36-4 who has special interest and knowledge in the diagnosis and treatment of cardiopulmonary problems.** If possible, the medical director shall be qualified by special training or be experienced in the management of acute and chronic respiratory disorders or both. The medical director is responsible for the quality, safety, and appropriateness of respiratory care services
